

## **Applications are invited for the position of Post Doctoral Research Fellow**

The Communication Economics and Electronic Markets Research Centre (CEEM) at Curtin University of Technology in Perth, Western Australia, undertakes academic and contract research in telecommunications economics. The Centre's primary focus is the quantitative analysis of digital communication and information networks. CEEM's Director is Gary Madden. Professor Madden's primary research area is the economic modelling of theoretically motivated short time-series forecasting, the economics of disruptive technologies, digital divide issues, network externalities and Internet evolution and the welfare impact of economic growth. He is the author of 78 peer-reviewed publications in these fields since 1993 and has attracted over \$1m to the University for his research since 1994. In particular, Gary has been Chief Investigator on four ARC Discovery Project (Large) grants since 1998. He is a consultant to government and a Member of the Board of Directors of the International Telecommunication Society. Gary is currently Associate Editor of Telecommunications Policy and of the International Journal of Management and Network Economics, and an Editorial Board Member of the Open Communication Science Journal and the Journal of Media Economics. He is a member of the International Editorial Board of Communications & Strategies.

CEEM is seeking a suitably qualified person for the position of Postdoctoral Research Fellow. The initial fixed-term appointment is for six months commencing on or after 1 July 2010. Applicants must have been awarded a research doctoral degree (equivalent to an Australian PhD degree). Demonstrated knowledge of, and experience in, quantitative research methods is essential. An existing record of publications would be highly regarded.

During the initial period the successful applicant would be considered for appointment to a four-year Curtin Research Fellowship. The objective of the Fellowship Scheme is to attract external and internal applicants to substantially enhance Curtin's research performance; increase Curtin's pool of higher degree by research supervisors; and attract highly talented staff with excellent potential for providing future academic leadership at Curtin.

List all current and previous appointments or positions held during the past five years. Please provide details of all publications and other academic outputs.
