### **Guidelines for Book Reviewers**

Books reviewed in the IJF cover forecasting theory, practical applications and methodology. In addition, new books that deal with any of the social and behavioral sciences are reviewed if they contribute to the advancement of forecasting.

#### Length of reviews

There is considerable pressure on the space available in the journal so, in order to bring a wide range of books to the attention of readers, two types of review are published: short and standard length reviews. The Book Review Editor will determine which type of review is appropriate for a given book.

#### *Short reviews*

These reviews should not exceed 300 words. They should provide a synopsis of the book's content and a brief evaluation.

#### *Standard length reviews*

These reviews should not exceed 1500 words. This is a maximum length - reviews that are shorter than this are acceptable.

#### Header

The header for the review should be presented in the following format:

#### References

Please keep references to other works to a minimum. References should appear in the standard IJF format indicated below.

In the text, references should appear for paper as "Klein (1984)", or for books as "Box & Jenkins (1970, p. 245".) At the end of the manuscript, the references should be listed alphabetically by surname of the first author. Use the following format:

For articles: Armstrong, J.S. & Collopy, F. (1992). Error measures for generalizing about forecasting methods: Empirical comparisons, *International Journal of Forecasting*, 8, 69-80.

For books: Cook, T.D. & Campbell, D.T. (1979). *Quasi-Experimentation*, Boston: Houghton Mifflin.

For collective works: Kahneman, D. & Tversky, A. (1982). Intuitive prediction: Biases and corrective procedures. In: D. Kahneman et al. (Eds.), *Judgment Under Uncertainty: Heuristics and Biases*. Cambridge; Cambridge University Press, pp. 414-421.

### Your name, affiliation and email address

Please type your name, affiliation and email address at the end of your review. Your email address will not be published but will be used by the publisher to send you page proofs for checking.

### Time for review

Please try to complete your review within three months of receipt of the book.

### Submission of review

Please submit your review electronically through the Elsevier Editorial System at <http://ees.elsevier.com/ijf/>. You will receive an e-mail with your username and password. When submitting your review, you should use "Author Login", select "Article Type" to be "Book review", and request Rob Hyndman as editor.

### After submitting your review

Before accepting your review for publication the Book Review Editor may make suggestions relating to its style, length and content. Following acceptance, the publishers will send you, by email, a copyright form and page proofs of your review for checking.

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
